Whole School Behaviour Plan

Our aim is to reward good behaviour. You will find that your child will come home with many awards and certificates.

We have a few basic rules and consequences as follows:

Rules

- Follow all instructions.
- Keep hands, feet and objects to yourself.
- Speak to others politely and quietly.
- Listen carefully when others are speaking.
- Own up to your mistakes.
- Take responsibility for your own behaviour.

Rewards

- ✓ Praise
- ✓ Stickers & stamps
- ✓ Star notes
- ✓ Student of the month
- ✓ Student of the week
- ✓ House points
- ✓ Class points
- ✓ Headteacher's Award

Consequences

- Formal verbal warning.
- 3 minutes time out.
- Yellow card (5 minutes detention)
- Red card - Removal from lesson & letter home to parents/carers.

Our School Behaviour Plan

Rules

- › Follow all instructions
- › Keep hands feet and objects to yourself
- › Speak to others politely and quietly
- › Listen carefully when others are speaking
- › Own up to your mistakes
- › Take responsibility for your own behaviour

Consequences

- > Formal verbal warning
- > Time out (time to think in a quiet part of the classroom)
- > Yellow Card (loss of 5 minutes of playtime)
- > Red Card (Removal from the class, loss of a playtime & a letter home to parents)

Rewards

- › Praise
- › Stickers
- › Star notes
- › House points
- › Lion spots (Class points)
- › Student of the week awards
- › Student of the month awards
- › Head teacher's Award

Our behaviour plan is designed to encourage children to take responsibility for their own actions and behaviour. It helps them to realise that poor behaviour has consequences and good behaviour is rewarded.

I am pleased to say that many more rewards are given out than consequences, as, for the majority of the time, the behaviour of our pupils is excellent.

Occasionally red cards are necessary, but you will always receive a letter home explaining the reason for the card & also asking for your support in correcting inappropriate behaviour.

Poor behaviour in school can often be linked to upsets at home and so we would ask you to inform school of any changes in home circumstances that may be having a negative effect on your child.

Our behaviour plan works because it is supported by parents/carers and this support is greatly appreciated.
